

Psalm 103 - Wisdom For The New Year

Psalm 103:1-5

 $\exists \exists \ \underline{barak}$ lit. to kneel; by implication to bless God (as an act of adoration).

"...forget not all his benefits." (Vs 2)

- Vs 3a He FORGIVES
- Vs 3b He HEALS (sometimes sickness and sin are related Psalm 38:1-8)
- Vs 4 He REDEEMS and RESTORES
- Vs 5 He RENEWS and SATISFIES strength and vitality like the eagle (see Isaiah 40:31)

Psalm 103:6-16

Exodus 33:28 – 34:9 - The Lord Passed before Moses

"The Lord passed before him and proclaimed, "The Lord, the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness..." (Exodus 34:6)

- Vs 8 is based on Exodus 34:6.
- This same description often repeated in Scripture in Scripture see Numbers 14:17-19; Psalm 86:5, 15; Psalm 145:8; Joel 2:13; Jonah 4:2.

TD្កា hesed lit. goodness, kindness, faithfulness (i.e. God's)

Psalm 103:17-22
